

THE SIGHTS OF LIVERPOOL IN 1749

IN the *Second Report of the Royal Commission on Historical Manuscripts*, p. 68, *The MSS of Sir Richard Puleston of Worthenbury, Co. Flint*, H.M. Stationery Office, 1871) there is reference to a letter from Liverpool, dated 11 May 1749, which mentions that the sights of the town were the ropeworks, the quarry hills, Mr. Dene's and Mr. Cobham's curiosities, the copperas house and pott house, the ladies walks, toy shops and china shops.
